PRINCIPAL INDIVIDUAL PLAYS OF GAME

List below **all** scoring plays. List non-scoring plays (except kickoffs) gaining 50 yards or more each. Under "type of play" indicate rushing, forward pass, interception runback, punt runback, kickoff runback, punt or field goal. Listing of forward pass play should give passer's name first, then receiver, and combined yardage of pass and run. Measure runbacks **only** from goal line, if started in end zone, as yardage carried in own end zone is of no value to team. All other plays are measured from line of scrimmage (see Official Rules at right).

OFFICIAL RULES FOR RECORDING FOOTBALL STATISTICS

(Issued by the N.C.A.A. Football Rules Committee's Sub-committee on Football Statistics)

FIRST DOWNS: A first down shall be recorded only when the yardsticks are ordered forward by the officials. Consequently, **no** first down is recorded when a touchdown is scored.

RUSHING: All offensive running plays are to be classified as rushing plays and **not** "plays from scrimmage", since "from scrimmage" may refer to any play begun with a snapback from center.

Rushing yardage is measured from the line of scrimmage to the point where the ball is declared dead.

The rushing total is a **net** figure. All rushing losses must be recorded so as to account for the net figure.

All gains on lateral passes which originated or grew out of a rushing play are included in rushing yardage.

FORWARD PASSING: Forward pass gains are measured from the scrimmage line to the point where the ball is declared dead, so as to include both length of pass and running advance after completion.

Loss from a completed forward pass which did not advance the ball to the scrimmage line is a yardage charge against passing gain.

Record any loss by a player apparently intending to pass but thrown behind the line as a **loss by rushing**. He is **not** a passer until he has thrown the ball, and he retains at all times the option of running.

Interception returns are measured from the point of interception to the point where the ball is declared dead.

There is no pass completed by penalty. A gain through interference on a passing play is a penalty against the defending team and the yardage involved is charged as penalty yardage against the defensive team. No pass attempted or completed will be recorded in the summary.

LATERAL PASSES: A lateral pass is always a component of the ultimate play, whether it precedes or follows that play. (Note: This rule refers to yardage credit only. The receiver of a lateral following a completed forward is credited with his yardage gain under "pass receiving", but should **not** be credited with a pass caught. His part is, in effect, merely extension of the original play.)

KICKS AND KICK RETURNS: Punts are measured from the line of scrimmage to the point of ultimate advance, if the ball remains in the field of play or goes out of bounds. (Note: "Ultimate advance" is the point where ball goes out of bounds, is downed, or is recovered by the defense to attempt a runback. In event of a receiver's muff, the punt is measured to point of recovery.)

When a punt goes over the goal line, distance of the punt is measured from the line of scrimmage to the 20-yard line **only**. (Note: This would be measured to the goal line in event of legal return from back of goal line.)

Like punts, kickoff distances are to be recorded by calculating the distance from the point kicked to the point where the opponent receives ball, or where it is recovered by the kicking team. Thus, an opening kickoff which goes in the end zone and is not returned is recorded as having gone 40 yards, since it will be put in play on the 20-yard line.

Punts blocked **are included** in item "Number of Punts" and the yardage of a partially blocked kick is included in yardage of punts. (Note: When a blocked punt is recovered by the defense the yards involved will be treated as a kick runback. When the kicking team recovers and advances a blocked punt the yardage involved will be recorded as a gain or loss by rushing. In any event the defense is credited with a blocked kick.)

Only the number of punts and kickoffs which the receiving team actually attempts to return are included under kick returns. The return will be measured from the point the returning player actually gains control of the ball to the point where the ball is declared dead unless the ball is lost, in which event measurement is to the point of the fumble.

On attempted field goals, since the goal posts are 10 yards behind the goal line, record the distance of attempted field goals as the distance from scrimmage line where ball was put in play to the goal line and add ten yards.

PENALTIES: All penalties and penalty yardage are charged to the team penalized regardless of whether it had possession of the ball.
