MICHIGAN vs. MINNESOTA Post Game Notes

GRBAC SETS MICHIGAN CAREER PASSING MARK

Elvis Grbac completed 14 of 19 passes for 208 yards today, giving him 5614 career passing yards, a new Michigan career record. Grbac surpassed the old record of 5449 career passing yards set by Jim Harbaugh in 1983-86 when he hit Derrick Alexander on a 52-yard touchdown pass with 13:09 remaining in the first quarter. Grbac also tied Harbaugh's Michigan career record of 19 150+yard passing games with his performance today. Grbac has thrown for over 150 yards against Minnesota (208 yards) and Notre Dame (242 yards) this season; Northwestern (229 yards), Purdue (175 yards), Minnesota (242 yards), Michigan State (161 yards), Iowa (196 yards), Florida State (212 yards), Notre Dame (195 yards), and Boston College (178 yards) in 1991; Mississippi (296 yards), Purdue (160 yards), Indiana (166 yards), Michigan State (213 yards), Wisconsin (154 yards), Maryland (172 yards), and Notre Dame (190 yards) in 1990; and Wisconsin (167 yards) and Maryland (187 yards) in 1989. Grbac is also Michigan all-time leader in completions (459), attempts (736), and touchdown passes (59).

ALEXANDER SETS MICHIGAN SINGLE GAME TOUCHDOWN RECORD

DerrickAlexander's four touchdown reception against Minnesota established a new Michigan single game record for touchdown receptions in a single game. Alexander's touchdown catches came on receptions of 52, 13, three, and 32 yards. Alexander broke the old record of three receiving touchdowns in a single game held by Ron Kramer (against Missouri in 1955), Greg McMurtry(at Minnesota in 1989), and Desmond Howard (at Boston College and against Indiana in 1991). Three of Alexander's touchdowns came in the first quarter, making him the only Wolverine besides McMurtry(three TD catches in second quarter at Minnesota in 1989) to catch three touchdown passes in a quarter. Alexander and McMurtryare also the only Michigan players to catch three TD passes in a half. Alexander's four total touchdowns place him in a tie for second in single game touchdowns with Tom Harmon (at California in 1940 and against Iowa in 1939), Garvie Craw (at Illinois in 1969), Fritz Seyferth (against Minnesota in 1970), Ed Shuttlesworth (against Minnesota in 1972), Rob Lytle (against Indiana in 1975), and Desmond Howard (at Boston College in 1991). Ron Johnson (five touchdowns against Wisconsin in 1968) holds the Michigan single game total touchdown record.

ALEXANDER'S GREATNESS

Alexandercaught seven passes for 130 yards today, making him the 12th Michigan receiver to amass 1000 career receiving yards. Alexandernow has 1096 career receiving yards (11th best in Michigan history), 73 career receptions (tied for ninth) and 15 career receiving touchdowns (tied for fourth). This season, Alexanderhas caught 33 passes for 480 yards (14.5 avg.) and eight touchdowns. Alexander's eight TD receptions this season tie him with Dick Rifeaburg (1948) for fourth place in single season touchdown receptions. Desmond Howard set the Michigan single season touchdown receiving record with 19 TD receptions last season.

GRBACTIES M TOUCHDOWN PASSING RECORD

In addition to breaking Michigan's career touchdown passing yardage record today, Grbactied Michigan's single game touchdown record by throwing four touchdown passes against Minnesota. Grbac threw touchdown passes of 52 (the longest pass for Michigan this season), 32, 13, and three yards, all of which were caught by Alexander Grbac's four touchdown passes tie the Michigan single game passing touchdown record set by Steve Smith (against Purdue in 1983), Chris Zurbrugg (at Purdue in 1984), Michael Taylor (at Minnesota in 1989), Grbac (against Mississisppi in the 1991 Gator Bowl and against Florida State in 1991), and Toda Collins (against Houston this season).

MINNESOTA NOTES

John Lewis' 88-yard kickoff return for a touchdown was the first touchdown on a kickoff return allowed by Michigan since Notre Dame's Raghib Ismail returned two kickoffs for touchdowns against Michigan in 1989... Marquel Fleetwood's 94-yard touchdown pass to Lewis was the longest pass play ever allowed by a Michigan team, and the second-longest play from scrimmage ever allowed by the Wolverines. The previous longest pass play by a Michigan opponent was an 88-yard pass from Minnesota's Ray Stephens to Charles Litten in 1968. The longest play from scrimmage ever allowed by Michigan was a 98-yard run by Minnesota's Darrell Thompson in 1987.

WONDERFULWHEATLEY

In his fourth straight game as Michigan's starting tailback, Tyrone Whentleyled the Michigan running attack with 148 yards and two touchdown on 24 carries (6.2 avg.). In his four starts, Whentleyhas gained 678 yards on 89 carries (7.6 avg.) and scored eight rushing touchdowns. This season, Whentley has carried the ball 102 times for 750 yards (7.4 avg.) and nine touchdowns. Additionally, Whentleyhas caught six passes for 66 yards and two touchdowns. Whentleynow has 1298 career rushing yards on 188 carries, giving him a Michigan record average of 6.9 yards per carry in his career.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

Ninef Aghakhan made his first career interception against the Gophers... Minnesota's first quarter kickoff return touchdown was the first touchdown Michigan has allowed in the first quarter since Notre Dame scored a TD in the first quarter of this season's opener... Today's attendance of 106,579 was the second-largest in Michigan and NCAA history, trailing only the 106,788 that were in attendance at Michigan's 35-10 victory of Michigan State two weeks ago at Michigan Stadium...Michigan and Minnesota combined fr 34 third quarter points, the most third quarter scoring by two teams in Michigan history. Michigan's 28 third quarter points tied the Michigan record for scoring in the third quarter set in 1971 against Iowa, 1972 against Navy, 1976 against Navy, and 1977 against Northwestern. The Michigan record for points scored in a quarter is 35, scored in the second quarter against Northwestern in 1982. The highest scoring by both teams in a quarter is 37 by Michigan and Ohio State in 1961... Michigan has scored over 60 points against two opponents this season (63 today and 61 against Houston), marking the first time since 1971, when Michigan scored over 60 points in back-to-back games (a 61-7 win over Indiana and a 63-7 win over Iowa) that Michigan has scored over 60 points in two games in a season... Michigan's time of possession today was 41:06, the most in school history, surpassing the old record of 40:40 set in 1991 against Notre Dame...For the second week in a row, Michigan's opponent did not convert on a third down situation. Minnesota was 0/13 on third down conversions-the least proficient third down performance by a Michigan opponent, surpassing Indiana's 0/12 mark set last week. Both time of possession and third down records have only been kept since 1981.

EVERITT EQUALS SUCCESS

Over the past three seasons, Michigan has compiled a 15-1-1 record in games in which Steve Everitthas been the starting center (6-0-1 in 1992, 7-0 in 1991, and 2-1 in 1990). Everitt has started every game for Michigan in the 1992 season. Everitt did not start in the 1992 Rose Bowl because of a knee injury, he miss starting in victories over Minnesota, Purdue, and Northwestern because of an ankle injury, and Everittdid not play in a loss to Florida State because of a broken jaw suffered in Michigan's 1991 win over Notre Dame. In 1990, Everittbroke his foot against Maryland, and did not start in Michigan's losses to Iowa and Michigan State or in Wolverine victories over Wisconsin, Indiana, and Purdue. Michigan's running attack has been more potent with Everitt in the starting lineup over the past three seasons. Over the past three seasons, Michigan has rushed for 5151 yards (Everitt wears #51) on 875 carries for an average of 5.9 yards per carry when Everitt starts. When Everitt was not in the starting lineup over the last three seasons, Michigan averaged 4.7 yards per carry (2864 yards on 607 carries). This season, with Everittstarting every game, Michigan is averaging 5.8 yards per carry (2059 yards on 354 attempts). In 1991, the Wolverines averaged 5.7 yards per carry (1849 yards on 324 attempts) when Everittstarted and 4.2 yards per carry (932 yards on 219 attempts) when he did not start. In 1990, Michigan averaged 6.3 yards per carry (1243 yards on 197 rushes) with Everittas the starting center and 4.9 yards per rush (1932 yards on 388 carries) when Everittdid not start.

BIG PLAY OFFENSE

Michigan scored touchdowns on three plays of over 25 yards today-WalterSmith's 54-yard touchdown run, Grbac's 52-yard touchdown pass to Alexander, and Grbac's 32-yard touchdown pass to Alexander This season, Michigan has scored 16 touchdowns on gains of over 25 yards, has six 50+ yard scoring plays, and has scored three times on gains of over 80 yards. Here is a breakdown of those long touchdown plays:

OPPONENTS IN NO RUSH

The Michigan defense had another strong game against Minnesota, limiting the Gophers to only 32 rushing yards on 20 attempts (1.6 avg.). Michigan's defense has held each of its last six opponents to less than 100 yards rushing: Minnesota 32 yards, Indiana 30 yards, Michigan State 66 yards, Okiahoma State 67 yards; Houston 52 yards; and Iowa 77 yards. Since the start of Gary Moeller's reign in 1990, the Michigan defense has held 18 opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground (Minnesota, Indiana, MSU, Iowa, Oklahoma State, and Houston this season; Illinois, Michigan State, Iowa, Notre Dame and Boston College in 1991; Mississippi, Illinois, Purdue, Iowa, Wisconsin, Maryland, and UCLA in 1990). Since 1990, Michigan is 17-1 in games in which the opposition has gained under 100 rushing yards. Michigan's opponents are averaging only 79.2 yards per game on the ground this season.

TYRONE'S TOUCHDOWNS

Wheatleys two touchdowns against the Gophers (on runs of two and four yards) lifted his season total to 12 touchdowns. Nine of Wheatley's touchdowns have come on the ground, two have been on pass receptions, and one came on a kickoff return. Wheatleyhas scored a touchdown in the last eight games he has played in (he did not see game action against Oklahoma State because of a groin injury), dating back to last year's Ohio State game. Wheatley has scored 21 touchdowns (18 rushing, two receiving, and one on a kickoff return) in 17 career games. The Michigan record for career rushing touchdowns is 34 (Rick Leach in 1975-78) and the career total touchdowns in a career is 40 (Anthony Carter in 1979-82).

ALEXANDER'S MILESTONES

In addition to his punt return heroics, Alexander caught three passes for 42 yards and one touchdown against Indiana. Alexander's performance against the Hoosiers moved him up on several Michigan career lists. Alexander now has 11 career touchdown receptions, good for a seventh place tie with Ralph Clayton (1976-79) on the Michigan career receiving touchdown list. Alexander now has 66 career receptions, the 12th most in school history. Alexander has 966 career receiving yards, 34 shy of 1,000 career receiving yards and the 14th most in school history. Alexander is also the seventh player in Michigan history to have two or more punt return touchdowns.

MICHIGAN TIES BIG TEN'S LONGEST WINNING STREAK

Michigan's 63-13 win over Minnesota extended the Wolverines' winning streak in Big Ten games to a record-tieing 17, dating back to a 24-23 loss to Iowa at Michigan Stadium in 1990. The Wolverines are now tied with Ohio State (1954-56, 1967-69, and 1974-76) for the longest Big Ten winning streak in conference history. Michigan had the longest overall (including non-conference games) winning streak (29 games in 1901-03) and the Big Ten's longest conference (56 games in 1900-05) and overall unbeaten streaks (22 games in 1901-05).
