Post-Game Notes Michigan vs. Northwestern

Northwestern scored 10 fourth-quarter points as the No. 25 Wildats upset the No. 7 Wolverines, 19-13. Michigan sophomore quarterback **Brian Griese** rushed for his first collegiate touchdown to give the Wolverines a 13-6 lead early in the second half, but the Wildcats answered with a **Steve Schnur** to **Matt Hart!** touchdown and two **Sam Valenzis!** field goals to beat Michigan for the first time in 30 seasons.

WILDCATS STOP SKID

The 19-13 victory over Michigan was Northwestern's first over the Wolverines since 1965, when NU won 34-22 at Evanston. It was also the Wildcats' first victory over Michigan at Michigan Stadium since the 1959 season.

BIAKABUTUKA BREAKS 200

Michigan tailback **Tshimanga Biakabutuka's** career-high 205 yards—including113 in the first half on 17 carries—gave Biakabutuka his third 100-plus yard rushing game this season (143 vs. Memphis, 117 at Boston College), and helped him eclipse the 1,500-yard career rushing yards mark. Biakabutuka became Michigan's first 200-yard rusher since **Tyrone Wheatley** rushed for 235 against Washington in the 1993 Rose Bowl.

MORE BIAKABUTUKA

Biakabutuka's 205 yards tied for 15th best single-game rushing total in Michigan history. Biakabutuka's 47-yard rush in the first quarter was Michigan's longest run from scrimmage on the season. Biakabutuka also produced the previous long run, 35 yards at Illinois. His previous career high for rushing yardage was 143, set earlier this season in Michigan's 24-7 win over Memphis.

GRIESE IN FOR SIX

Sophomore quarterback Brian Griese scored his first collegiate touchdown on a three-yard keeper on Michigan's first drive of the second half.

MAKING THEIR POINT EARLY

Junior Remy Hamilton's first field goal of the game marked the first points surrendered by the Northwestern defense in the first quarter all season. With a 3-0 advantage over the Wildcats after 15 minutes, Michigan has now outscored its opponents in the first quarter, 38-0. The Wolverines' total first-half scoring advantage for the season climbed to 74-19. NU's six first-half points were almost half of the total points surrendered by the Michigan defense in the first half all season (13).

The game also marked the first time Northwestern failed to score in the first quarter this season.

HIGH RETURNS

Mercury Hayes' 40-yard kickoff return in the second quarter was the longest of the season for Michigan.

126 AND COUNTING

The attendance of 104,642 gave Michigan its 126th consecutive game of 100,000-plus fans.

NU KICKER BREAKS FG MARK

Northwestern kicker Sam Valenzisi's four field goals give him 10 consecutive FGs, breaking the previous Northwestern record of nine. It was his third consecutive game with three field goals and his sixth career game with three FGs or more. The four FGs ties his own single-game mark, and tied him for most FGs in a game by a Michigan opponent.

The combined six field goals by both teams tied the Michigan record for most field goals in a game by two teams, and was the first time Michigan and its opponent combined for six FGs since Michigan State and U-M kicked six in 1994.

OTHER NORTHWESTERN NOTES

NU tailback **Darnell Autry** (103 yards) recorded his sixth consecutive 100-yard game, a new Wildcat record. It was Autry's seventh 100-yard game of his career.

Quarterback Chris Hamdorf's completion to Darren Drexler was the QB's first of his career. It was also Drexler's longest reception of his career.

Steve Schnur's 46-yard completion to D'Wayne Bates was Northwestern's longest completion of the season.

POST-GAME QUOTES

Michigan vs. Northwestern Oct. 7, 1995

FROM THE MICHIGAN PRESS ROOM

Head Coach Lloyd Carr: (On the game in general...) "First I want to say Northwestern deserves the win. They played hard with intelligence and made the big plays.

"It is a difficult loss in the stadium and it gives us an uphill look for the championship.

"We have no excuses. We had chances but didn't take advantage of them...we have to stop turning over the ball. We prepared well and we ran the ball well, we just didn't execute the passing game. Our running game was very good and we broke some big plays."

(On bouncing back...) "You find out what you are made of when you face adversity. We had great momentum, we'll have to go to work to get it back."

(On the potential of pulling Griese...) "I didn't think about pulling him. He had some passes dropped and I think on one of the interceptions, Amani (Toomer) fell down."

(On looking ahead, especially the seniors...) "Seniors are not kids who will lay down and let a loss affect their attitude. Our challenge will be to correct our course and go back with renewed determination."

(On comparing this loss with any other...) "Any time you lose it is disappointing, it doesn't matter. I don't want to waste time thinking about it, this is tough enough.

(On the keys to the game...) "It was all the mistakes. We came out in the third quarter and perhaps had the best drive of the season and at that point I thought we would win the game.'

FROM THE NORTHWESTERN PRESS ROOM **Head Coach Gary Barnett:**

(On the Northwestern defense...) "Our defense was just relentless out there, the fourth down goal-line stance and the third down conversions that we prevented. It was a tremendous effort by our defensive kids to just keep playing hard. We made enough plays on offense and took advantage of our special teams talent and we were able to eek out a win in a tough situation.'

(On the victory...) "We got some turnovers today which were critical in the outcome of this game. We had that one turnover on the kickoff return and that's what we have been able to do so far is not turn the ball over and create some turnovers. It was just a great team win, obviously this is big for our university and big for our football program. Its a heck of a way to get to 4-1."

(On comparing this game with the Notre Dame game...) "For me personally, this was a bigger win than that one because I was tutored in the Michigan heritage by Bill McCartney, so for me this was a pretty big win. For our football team its huge because of the Big Ten and the fact that we can be 2-0 so far in the conference. They are both huge.

(On turnovers...) "Anytime that you get turnovers they are critical, but we had not moved the ball very well in the game so our ability to take those turnovers and do something with them immediately was really critical because we weren't going to march the ball up and down the field on Michigan, they are too good and we were not on all cylinders early. So I think that being able to capitalize and be opportunistic when we were was critical in this

(On the game strategy...) "Before the game we talked about how it was going to go down to the last play of the game and we needed to get into the fourth quarter and I told our guys we'd win the game."

(On Northwestern's overall play...) "We were able to mix up enough pressure and play with some great coverage out of our secondary guys. That made us very effective."
