Michigan vs. UCLA Game Notes

September 28, 1996

100,000 STREAK REACHES 11 DOZEN

Today's announced crowd of 106,011 give Michigan a 132-game consecutive home streak with at least 100,000 fans present. The streak began with a 28-0 win over Purdue on Nov. 8, 1975 and has spanned 22 years and five presidential administrations.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS

Michigan's defense held UCLA without a point in the first quarter, keeping the opponents scoreless in the first quarter of the 1996 season. The Wolverines have allowed only 16 first quarter points in their last 17 games, and have not allowed a touchdown to a regular-season opponent (in the first quarter) since Nov. 5, 1994 versus Purdue.

THE LONG ASCENT

With his 236 passing yards against UCLA, junior/sophomore quarterback **Scott Dreisbach** (Mishawaka, IN) has moved from 19th to 16th on Michigan's all-time passing yardage list. Dreisbach, who now has 1,603 yards passing in his eight games, needs 53 yards to move past **Bob Timberlake** for 15th (1656 yards, 1962-64).

20 POINT NOTES

The 21 points Michigan scored in the second quarter of today's game marks the first 20 point (or more) quarter since Michigan scored 21 against Minnesota on Oct. 26, 1995. The Wolverines last scored at least 20 points in the second quarter when they notched 21 points against North Carolina State in the Hall of Fame Bowl on Jan. 1, 1994. This also snapped Michigan's streak of scoring exactly 20 points in the last four consecutive games.

CHRIS CROSSES GOAL LINE - RUSHING

Junior Chris Howard's (River Ridge, LA) four rushing touchdowns against UCLA tied him for the second most by a Michigan player in a game (Ron Johnson holds the record with five against Wisconsin in 1968). Four other U-M players tallied four rushing touchdowns in a game. The most recent was Rob Lytle versus Indiana in 1975. Howard's 31-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter was the first rushing TD of his career. Howard, who previously only had two touchdowns receiving, had 109 yards rushing on the afternoon, posting his first 100 yard rushing game.

WOODSON LOOKS FOUR WAYS

Sophomore cornerback **Charles Woodson** (Fremont, OH) made it into the play-by-play four different ways in the UCLA game. Woodson took a handoff on the opening kickoff (gained 13 yards) and later in the first half caught his first career pass for 13 yards. In the second half, Woodson recorded a 31-yard run on Michigan's fourth touchdown drive, and intercepted two passes. The two interceptions matches his career best set versus Ohio State in 1995. His 27-yard interception returning set a career best, and a 1996 team season best.

REMY RISES INTO TOP SIX

With eight points (five PATs, one FG) against the Bruins, senior **Remy Hamilton** (Boca Raton, FL) moved ahead of Wolverine legend **Desmond Howard** (1989-91) on Michigan's all-time scoring list. Hamilton now ranks sixth with 223 points is 14 points shy of Michigan's other Heisman Trophy winner **Tom Harmon** (237 points, 1938-40) for fifth place.

ANES DEBUT

Freshman fullback John Anes (Kentwood, MI) made his offensive debut in the second half of the win versus UCLA. The Wolverines used three rushers in the first half and a total of eight for the game. Anes recorded a team high 17 carries for 83 yards all coming in the second half. His 83 yards was second best on the team versus UCLA behind Chris Howard's 109 yards).

POST-GAME QUOTES

Michigan vs. UCLA September 28, 1996

FROM THE MICHIGAN PRESS ROOM

Head Coach Lloyd Carr:

(On the game in general...) "We'll find something to work on but certainly I think this is the best, outside of the Colorado game, that we've played this year. I thought that we played tremendously well on defense. I never dreamt that we would do the things we did to UCLA. I thought with their speed and movement that they would score some points and I was very pleased with the way we played with our effort. I thought our intensity was outstanding and offensively after a terribly slow start, again we went down and had an opportunity the first possession and threw an interception, so if we can get past the first quarter then we'll be all right. I thought our offensive coaches, Fred Jackson and all those guys, did a great job establishing a running game against a defense that's extremely hard to run against and then we hit some big passes that gave us some big plays. The other thing I feel very good about is in the fourth quarter we got to play a lot of young guys, we got our quarterbacks some experience. When I look back at this non-conference schedule, I am very pleased with the way we came out of it. We're positioned right where we'd like to be going into the run for the roses and I think our team is excited."

(On Chris Howard...) "I did not think based on the way he ended last week that he would be able to play. He came out and ran without discomfort. On Wednesday he really looked good and we are a different team when we can run with both of those guys (Williams and Howard).

Quarterback Scott Dreisbach:

(On the game overall...) "We had great team spirit and stuck together and had a great day offensively."

(On the UCLA defense...) "They are a very fast and very physical defense. We were able to do what we wanted, but it took a while."

Cornerback/Wide Receiver Charles Woodson:

"We had 11 people getting to the ball. We put a lot of pressure on the quarterback, making him scramble and just played good solid defense in the secondary. I think we rattled them early, and it carried through the game."

"On the reverse, their sideline kept yelling out so I knew they were going to know what was happening, so I ran around when I first got the ball and there was just a huge wall, and I knew I wasn't going to get anything there. I just switched it around and there was a lot of open field, and I went for it."

"I think we were the more physical team today and it showed. We went in there early and we tried to put some hits on those guys and put a lot of pressure on them and just rattled them early and kept it on them."

"That feels real good, to be able to come off of defense and then to be able to go to the offensive side of the field, it's just a great feeling to know that the coaches want to use you in that way. When I get out there, I try my best to make something happen and today I was able to do that."

"You can't say enough about what the offense did today. They played a great game. We've been waiting on it all year and it finally came. All I can do is congratulate those guys for what they did. Our offensive line, they did a great job springing holes for our running backs. Also Scott Dreisbach did another good job today, he keeps winning so we are going to keep riding with him."

Head Coach Bob Toledo:

(On the game in general)

"Let me make something very clear. We played against an outstanding Michigan football team. We can't b.s. ourselves about that. They're a very good football team. We didn't play very well. Most of that is probably due to the fact that they are a very good football team."

(On the Bruins' offensive performance)

"Offensively we couldn't get anything going. That's a real credit to their defense. We couldn't get any running game going. When we had guys open, we didn't hit them. When we did hit them, they dropped the ball."

(On the Bruins defensive performance)
"Defensively we gave up some big plays. They kept running one play over and over again and got after us pretty good. A lot of credit's got to go to them. We're a young football team that needs to get better. Our preseason's over. We go into league next weekend against Oregon. We've got a lot of improving to do."

(On Rosco Zamano's injury)

"We lost Zamano to a very serious injury. He's in the hospital right now being operated on. It's a total dislocation of his knee. I understand an artery has ruptured. It's very, very serious. His family has been contacted. It kind of puts football in perspective. Here's a guy who's hurt badly. We lost a football game."

(On Michigan's performance)

"We're not about to point any fingers at anybody. They're a great team. We'll go back to work next week. We'll move on and wish Michigan a lot of luck. I think they're a great team. Lloyd Carr's done a super job with that program."

"They've got some good football players. Obviously they've got guys that are playmakers. They made plays when they had to and we didn't. We had guys covered sometimes and couldn't make the plays. They've got some outstanding athletes and did a good job."

(On the Wolverines' intensity)

"They're a real physical football team. I think some of their skilled athletes showed up today too which they hadn't done a lot of in the first couple of games. They're a physical football team. They've got a great defense. They've got an experienced defensive football team and they got them the ball back an awful lot. We couldn't get anything going."

(On Charles Woodson)

"He obviously is a special guy. When you move over to play offense right away you think 'well, maybe their receivers aren't that good but really it's just to take advantage of his athletic ability. Players make plays and their players made some big plays today."
