Michigan vs. Colorado Game Notes

ATTENDANCE STREAK CONTINUES

With a crowd of 106,474, Michigan extended its string of consecutive 100,000 plus crowds in Michigan Stadium to 136 games. The attendance is the largest for a home-opener (surpassing Notre Dame in 1991: 106,138) and the seventh largest in Michigan Stadium history. The streak, which started November 8, 1975 (vs. Purdue), has spanned 22 seasons, with the Wolverines sporting a 111-24-1 record. In each of the campaigns U-M has led the nation in attendance.

CARR REMAINS PERFECT AGAINST TOP 10, IN SEPTEMBER

With the 27-3 victory, Coach Lloyd Carr ran his record to 4-0 against teams ranked in the top ten. Michigan has now defeated five consecutive teams ranked in the top ten, dating back to a 1994 Holiday Bowl win over Colorado State. Carr is a perfect 8-0 in September with five of the wins coming at Michigan Stadium. In his tenure, the maize and blue have out-scored opponents 228-92 in the month of September.

FLOYD'S FIRST

Senior Chris Floyd's (Detroit, MI) one yard touchdown dive not only opened Michigan's season scoring, but was also his first career touchdown. Floyd took the handoff from quaterback Brian Griese (Miami, FL) and dove over the top of the line to give Michigan a 7-0 lead at 9:28 of the first quarter.

DEFENSE CORRALS BUFFS

Michigan's defense proved opportunistic against Colorado, limiting the Buffaloes to three points and 224 total offensive yards. U-M forced four turnovers. The Wolverines' offense utelized the interceptions to place 17 points on the board (two touchdowns, one field goal).

The first half belonged to the defensive backs as Charles Woodson (Fremont, OH) and Tommy Hendricks (Houston, TX) both grabbed interceptions. Woodson's theft was the eleventh of his career, tying him for fifth on the U-M all-time list (with Vada Murray, Thom Darden, and Rick Volk). Woodson is one interception shy of third and two from second. The turnover led to Michigan's first scoring drive (finished with a one yard Floyd touchdown run).

Hendricks' interception at the 15 yard line, the first of his career, ended Colorado's deepest

penetration of the half.

The linebackers turned in the Wolverines' interceptions in the second half as junior Clint Copenhaver (Brighton, MI) and sophomore Dhani Jones (Potomac, MD) picked off passes. Fourthyear junior Clint Copenhaver added another interception at 10:06 of the third quarter. Both led to scoring drives for Michigan.

WOODSON WATCH

Wolverine standout Charles Woodson had another stellar day. The consensus All-American played 66 downs on defense, ten on special teams, and three on offense. Colorado only threw at Woodson on five of their 40 passes, completing three of them with one interception.

TAI GRABS 50TH

Tai Streets hauled in his 50th career reception on a four-yard pass from Brian Griese, early in the first quarter. Streets ended the game with five receptions for 36 yards.

GRIESE PASSES INTO TOP 10, TOP 20

Brian Griese pushed into a tie for ninth on the Michgan career touchdown pass list with a pair of tosses. He moved into tenth on his first TD strike, a five-yard pass to Chris Howard, with 10:26 left in the third quarter giving U-M a 17-0 lead. Just 1:44 later, the fifth-year senior connected with Russell Shaw on a six yard pass. Griese's 18 career touchdown passes ties him with both Dennis Brown (1966-68) and Dennis Franklin (1972-74), five behind Bob Chappuis (1942-47).

The fifth-year senior finished the day 21-28 with 258 yards and the two touchdown passes. It marks the third time Griese has topped the 250-yard mark, and is the 18th highest passing total in Michigan

history.

TUMAN FEASTS ON BUFFALOES

Jerame Tuman posted a career day with five receptions for 126 yards, both career-highs. Tuman's first reception, a 53-yard catch and run set up U-M's first score, a Chris Floyd one-yard scoring plunge. Last year in Boulder, the fourth-year junior tight end corralled the winning touchdown pass.

BUFFS OFFENSE STRUGGLES

Michigan's defense held Colorado to three points, their lowest output since November 12, 1988, (101 games) when Nebraska shut the Buffaloes out. CU's 224 yards are also the fewest the program has produced since Nebraska in 1992 (144 yards).

COLORADO FALTERS ON THE ROAD

This is the first time CU has lost back-to-back road games since 1987, when they fell to Oklahoma State and Oklahoma. The Buffaloes are still an impressive 37-8-1 in their last 46 road contests.

NEUHEISEL NOTES

Colorado head coach Rick Neuheisel is 21-5 for his career, including an 8-5 mark against ranked opponents.

COLORADO INJURY UPDATE

Colorado guard Aaron Wade sprained an MCL in his knee. Wide receiver Robert Toler suffered a concussion.

Michigan vs. Colorado September 13, 1997 Post-Game Quotes

FROM THE MICHIGAN LOCKER ROOM:

HEAD COACH LLOYD CARR

(On whether or not it was easy winning the game ...) "No it wasn't easy. I am proud of the football team. We recognized that Colorado had an extra game and we had to negate that advantage. We played with great intensity and the kicking game was very good."

(On the offense ...) "We made some first game mistakes, but we showed signs of having a pretty good offense. It was a great way to start."

(On blitzing the Colorado defense ...) "On Wednesday I asked (the defensive coordinator Jim) Herrmann if he was going to go after them. He said we'll come after the quarterback every way we can. (Colorado quarterback John) Hessler is a tough kid. He went down a lot, but he stood in there. The kids really got to the ball."

"When you can stop the run, you've got them one dimensional. Our drive to open the second half took the run away from them."

(On the defense in general ...) "(Jim) Herrmann, (Vance) Bedford, and (Brady) Hoke, all of those guys know the game. One thing we did poorly a year ago is that we didn't create enough turnovers. We did that today and it was a big factor.

(On the play of quarterback Brian Griese ...) "Brian Griese was excellent. When we had poor down and distances, he didn't force anything. He is smart. I think he'll show he is a better quarterback than he is given credit for."

(On the game in general ...) "I was glad when we hit that final field goal which gave us the 24-point lead. That meant Colorado had to score three touchdowns and three two-point conversions to tie. That was the first time I relaxed.

(More on the defense ...) "It was a spirited effort. It took a good offensive football team and held them to three points."

(More on Griese ...) "(Brian is) a composed guy. He doesn't get rattled, and that translates to a young offensive line. (Jeff) Backus, (Steve) Hutchinson, (Steve) Frazier, and (Chris) Ziemann, it was the first time they played, and they were nervous. (Griese) did a good job settling down the line."

(On the punting ...) "Jason Vinson was tremendous. He turned the ball over and he didn't shank any. It's amazing. He and Eric Mayes came in as walk-on. They were living a dream."

FROM THE COLORADO LOCKER ROOM

Colorado coach Rick Neuheisel

On why Colorado lost:

"We got our tails whipped. They played well on both sides of the ball. I thought our defense hung in there but you can not turn the ball over the number of times we did and have success against a ball control team as talented as Michigan. It's not a mystery why the outcome was the way it was. I am disappointed with the way we played but I am not giving up on the season."

On coming back after this loss:

"Obviously we've got kids who have been through this stuff. We've got to go back and make ourselves better."

On Quarterback John Hessler's performance:

"We had guys open and I just believe that he can play better and I am assuming that he will."

On helping Hessler to regain his confidence:

"I don't know any other way to coach quarterbacks than the way I do it. I've been in the situation John's in. I threw four interceptions myself against Georgia back in 1983 and ended up coming back and having a decent year. He's just got to respond. One thing about Hessler is that he is tough. I expect him to come back and work hard and be a much better player."

On staying with Hessler for most of the game:

"I was going to use Adam sooner had they scored a touchdown there at the end of the game. When they took the field goal. When they took the three points, we were down 24 and there's still a chance to score three times and get three 2-point conversions. As far-fetched as that may seem, I still think that way and that's why I went with John one more series."

On the letdown of losing this nationally attractive game:

"It is because our kids look so forward tot he game any time you invest a great deal of time in a ball game you want to play well and come out and be whipped like we were is very discouraging. But as I told the football team, there's a lot of football left. Nebraska got beat 19-0 and ended up winning there conference. We have tough kids who have been through this before. We lost to Michigan a year a go and came back and won the rest of our games until the Nebraska game. It isn't out of the realm of possibility that we can come back and have a very good football team. We just have to realize that we are not yet a very good football team and we have to make the necessary adjustments to that we can improve."

On the Colorado vs. Michigan series:

"It's been a great series. I wish we would have given them a better game today. They are a fine football team, a fine football program. I congratulated Lloyd Carr. It is a shame that these kind of games are becoming a dying breed because they are exciting for the college football fan."

On today's game:

"I didn't have a very good day. I struggled. I've just got to stay up and continue to get better for the next game."

On today's game:

"I always want to play well. We put a lot of work into a game like this."
