WOLVERINE WARMUP

Michigan kicks off the 2010 season with a trip to Santa Barbara, California to take on four teams ranked in LAX Magazine's top-10. The Wolverines are coming off a 20-11 exhibition game loss to NCAA Division III Adrian College.

BRUISING BRUINS

First up for #5 Michigan (0-0) is a matchup with #10 UCLA (0-0). The Wolverines and Bruins met twice last season with Michigan winning both games.

Like Michigan, UCLA has yet to play a regular season game. The Bruins are 2-0-1 in their three scrimmages. UCLA defeated USC and Occidental by a combined 46-9 margin and tied Claremont 11-11.

Last season, UCLA went 12-9 including a 2-2 record at Nationals.

HELPING HAND

Amy Johnson's 32 career assists ranks third all-time. The senior attacker needs seven more helpers to tie Jane Friend's program record of 39 and she is just two assists behind Alyson Gilbride for second place.

GOOD IN GOAL

Sophomore Emmy Scheidt is well on pace to shatter the school record for saves after turning away 180 shots in her rookie season. Scheidt needs just 60 saves this year to match Jackie Fu's 240 career saves.

CLIMBING THE LADDER

Junior midfielder Britt Boehm continues to move up the offensive charts as she currently ranks in the top-ten in goals, points and assists.

DON'T TEST DYNER

Senior midfielder Arielle Dyner is Michigan's all-time leader in passes intercepted. After picking off six as a sophomore in her rookie season, Dyner came up with three more takeaways last season.

FAMILIAR FACES

Several Wolverines were teammates even before donning the Maize & Blue. The trio of Quinn Golinske, Emmy Scheidt and Maddie Palmer played four years together under the coaching of Jen Dunbar, Ginny Hughes and Kasey Hughes at Birmingham United. Mynda Krato and Melissa Oddo spent four years together at Grosse Pointe South High School while Rachel Stattler and Alaina Mezwa played three years together at Sacred Heart High School.

GROWTH SPURT

With the additions of sophomore Maddie Palmer (5'10) and freshman Jane Petoskey (6'1) the Michigan attack now boasts four players who are 5'10 or taller. Joining Palmer and Petoskey are junior Rachel Killian (5'10) and senior Amy Johnson (5'10).

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

The Wolverines will play against ten teams which rank in the WDIA top-20 this season: #1 Virginia Tech, #3 Colorado, #4 Santa Clara, #7 Cal Poly, #8 Colorado St., #9 Lindenwood, #10 UCLA, #15 Michigan St., #18 Minnesota and #19 Pittsburgh.

Coach Dunbar on the schedule: "Every year we try to schedule the best teams in the country to challenge ourselves throughout the season. The good teams bring out the best in us. If we truly hope to be the best, we have to play against the best in the country."

After this weekend's games, the Wolverines will take on Toledo Sunday, February 21 to in a WCLL conference game at Oosterbaan Fieldhouse at 7:30.

COACH'S CORNER

"We keep telling the team we have to get better and better every time we step on the field. Unfortunately starting our schedule as we are leaves little room for fighting the learning curve early in the season. We go out there and face great competition right away. We have to go out very strong as well as get better with each half we play. CLUB CAPTAINS

Michigan will have tri-captains for the 2010 season including seniors Arielle Dyner (*Livingston*, *N.J./Livingston*) and Amy Santoriello (*Westfield*, *N.J./Westfield*) along with junior Britt Boehm (*Rocky River, Ohio/Magnificant*).

WOLVERINES HOLD CLINIC

Prior to its exhibition game against Adrian, Michigan held its eighth annual clinic at Oosterbaan Fieldhouse. Over 80 participants, ranging from middle school to high school levels packed Oosterbaan and were led through a series of different skill stations by the team.

MICHIGAN RANKED FIFTH

The Wolverines earned a No. 5 ranking in the LAX Magazine Preseason Poll. Michigan is the only team north of the Mason-Dixon line in the top-14.

PRESEASON FAVORITES

LAX Magazine has tabbed Michigan as the preseason favorites in the WCLL Division I North, edging intrastate rivals Michigan State. Michigan will face all of its Division I North opponents at home this year with the exception a trip to East Lansing where it will take on Michigan State.


