







Gov't gains +(a+c)


Country: + c - b

Figure 3: 12-month Proportional Change in Import Prices by Tariff Wave



Tariff Incidence, US


- Tariff

 - lowers it abroad hardly at all:










Trade talks can begin within weeks






European Council Council of the European Union








